Most globally traded food.


10-12% of the population derives their livlihood from seafood globally.

59.51 million people were engaged (on a full-time, part-time or occasional basis) in the primary sector of capture fisheries (39.0 million people) and aquaculture (20.5 million people).

Women accounted for 14% of the total, (19 percent% in aquaculture and 12% in capture fisheries).

Of all those engaged in primary production, most are in developing countries, and most are small-scale, artisanal fishers and aquaculture workers.

When post-harvest operations data are included, it is estimated that one in two workers in the sector is a woman.
